Dear Friends,

One thing about the winter months is the *extended darkness*. During the Christmas season all the twinkling lights and outdoor displays brightened up our homes and neighborhoods, but now it's back to shorter darker days. I feel for the students waiting for the 6:50 am school bus. I hesitate to go for a walk after dinner. I celebrate the one extra minute of light every day or so!

Darkness and light are powerful spiritual images that fill scripture and the writings of faithful people of many traditions. The following is an old Hasidic tale from the Jewish tradition that speaks to me of the vital need for relationship and community.

"The rabbi asked his students: 'How can we determine the hour of dawn, when the night ends and the day begins?' One of the rabbi's students suggested: 'When from a distance you can distinguish between a dog and a sheep?' 'No,' was the answer. 'It is when one can distinguish between a fig tree and a grapevine?' asked another student. 'No,' the rabbi said. 'Please tell us the answer,' all the students requested. The rabbi replied, 'It is when you can look into the face of another human being and you have enough light in you to recognize your brother or your sister. Until then it is night, and darkness is still with us.'"

There sure is a lot of judgmental divisive talk filling the airwaves in this election year. It compounds the darkness of human sinfulness that assails us every year. It opposes the gospel of Jesus Christ who came to forgive, reconcile and make new. This year, let's regularly wait upon the Light of the World in prayer - maybe light a candle and meditate upon it, asking the Lord to open your eyes and fill you with his light. Perhaps that way we will recognize our Savior in our neighbors and be beacons of forgiveness and reconciliation. Wouldn't that be God's blessing to his world?!

PARISH HEALTH MINISTRY UPDATE

Hope everyone had a safe and Happy New Year and that you are well prepared for this winter season. Here is a quick check list for your home, personal and environmental safety.

- Installed new batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors
- Checked expiration date on over the counter medications
- Received a flu shot this fall
- Salt available to use on slippery outside steps, driveways and sidewalks
- Carry bag of kitty litter in car for slippery surfaces around car
- Emergency supplies in home for any power outages
- Seal leaks around windows and doors to prevent drafts and lower utility bills
- *If living in older home and have cracks in basement cement floors or walls; consider having a check for radon in your home, especially if you are a cigarette smoker*

“Radon is a colorless, odorless, radioactive gas present outdoors and indoors. It can be found at higher levels in some houses and other buildings. Radon breaks down into solid radioactive elements that can damage the DNA inside body’s cells. Exposure to radon gas and cigarette smoke causes greater risk of lung cancer.” (American Cancer Society*)

Blood pressure screening is available at the Community Dinners on Tuesday, January 26, 2016 and February 23, 2016 from 4 PM – 6:30 PM.

7 Reasons Why Our Church Nursery is Vital to Our Church

Too often serving in the church nursery can seem like a thankless job, but it shouldn't be that way. Here are 7 reasons why serving in the nursery is important.

- Reason #1: God is in the church nursery. This may come as a shock, but the Bible has specific promises about God's presence when children are welcomed and loved in Jesus' name. (Matthew 18:2-5, Mark 10:15, Luke 9:47-48)

- Reason #2: Your service in the nursery allows churchgoers to focus on worship rather than worrying about their children, and it gives the children freedom and comfort to be themselves.

- Reason #3: The first and sometimes lasting feelings a child will have toward church is formed in the nursery. A positive experience in the church nursery leaves an important impression.

- Reason #4: When you serve in the nursery, you are being entrusted with the most important and vulnerable members of the church family. There is no greater treasure on this side of heaven than the little ones God has given us. You must be someone special to have a job that is so important.

- Reason #5: Your service is essential for your own spiritual growth. A growing Christian is always a serving Christian. Jesus put others first, and when you serve in the church nursery you are following his example.

- Reason #6: The church nursery is the first contact young families have with our congregation. Your friendly greeting and care for their children can make a great first impression for the church and encourage them to return.

- Reason #7: Your service in the nursery is a powerful opportunity for prayer. If every nursery worker would spend several minutes praying over and with the children in their care, an environment of spiritual nurture would be created to bless the children under your care, their families and the whole congregation.

We need faithful people to serve in the church nursery on Sunday mornings and for special services. Darlene Mock has been the coordinator for the nursery schedule and she would love to hear of your willingness to take a turn. This is a hope-filled ministry because we have so few infants and toddlers who use the nursery just now. Consider the hope in your heart for the next generation of the congregation and volunteer today. Thank you.

Sharing Ministry and Mission

A feature of our Sunday worship during the fall has been the sharing of Ministry Teams and mission-related groups. We are learning and re-learning the faithful, caring things that the congregation undertakes in order to “*Glorify God, Make Disciples, and Meet Human Needs.*” The presenters have done a wonderful job, and each week’s sharing has been inspirational!

The church is filled with inspiring stories of faith. Each of us has a story to tell of our individual faith journeys and how the Lord has blessed us along our way through caring people and the church community. We are blessed by **Jackie Peel** to share her faith story this month.

When I was asked to write about my journey of faith, it took me back 66 years ago. There was a woman who lived across our road and she was as you would say today, an evangelist. She would come to our house and carry me to her house for Sunday School. Several kids in the neighborhood came to her tiny house. She also had us over for many years for vacation Bible School. I can still see those flannel or felt Bible characters on the felt easel. She led me to Jesus when I was 7 years old. We all called her “Grandma Smith.”

She had a son and his family that lived next door to her. I became friends with his oldest daughter and began to go to church with them.

On Sundays, we had Sunday School then church. Sunday evenings was the young people group then church. Wednesday was prayer meeting evening. During the summer we went to church camp and we had 2 weeks of revival services at our church. It was great! I loved it all.

My parents never went to church and didn’t discuss it. So all through my school years I went to church with Mrs. Smith’s family. I thank God for them and their guidance.

After school I got married and started my family. I took them to church for a while but eventually stopped. My ex-husband wouldn’t go so I didn’t go either. Not a very good excuse.

Throughout my life I held on to those things I learned at church, always prayed, occasionally went to church. Basically I turned my back on God and went off on my own. Mrs. Smith’s grandchildren also quit going to church.

Then in the 1990’s many things in my life were overwhelming. My mom, one of my brothers died. In the same month my oldest sister was wiped out by Hurricane Andrew and a tornado came through our yard. My youngest brother went through hours of brain surgery. Then my youngest grandson at 4 months was diagnosed with a rare bone cancer on his jaw bone (only 8 cases in the United States). I went to my knees. You are never taller than when you are on your knees talking to God. I immediately felt his presence and calmness came to me. He was still there! My grandson is now 17 years old. Praise God!

Soon after, I started going to church with different friends at work. Then another friend asked me to come to her church and sing in the choir. Thank you Normajean Marshall!

I feel God has always placed people in my life. And, finally back to him.

Thank you everyone at Reedurban who has prayed for me and my family.


